<b>Sustainability of spending</b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>The profile of football and netball have been raised significantly. The school now has established teams, which will continue to thrive. The skills of the teachers have been developed through working with the coach.</b></li> <li>• <b>Through the partnership we have with SCS the teachers have developed their skills in teaching PE, which are transferable into their own practice.</b></li> <li>• <b>The gym equipment is now fully installed. This is being used daily by the children and has improved motivation and stamina in some of our least active pupils; they will now independently choose to spend time on the gym equipment.</b></li> <li>• <b>Due to the investment made last year to establish clubs, enough interest has been raised for the clubs to sustain themselves, even after they changed to require a fee. 45.25% of KS2 children take part in a sports club either after school or during lunchtime.</b></li> </ul>
